Special Instructions for Advisors:

The world of theatre is extraordinarily rewarding, but also demanding and competitive. Academic loads are not light, production work is demanding, so students wishing to prepare for success in careers in theatre are must develop extraordinary work ethic and discipline in the development of their vocal, physical, mental, and emotional attributes and skills. The development understanding of acting performance is needed by each technician, and the development of a technical skill is need by each performer. Private voice, singing in the Musical Theatre Ensemble, and dance classes are suggested every semester for all performers.

Theatre Participation is required for all students on Theatre Activity Scholarship.

Goal and Career Development is required every semester that a student is a declared Theatre Major, for a minimum of four credits. This class substitutes for PREP 499 Career Preparation and Planning which is a General Education requirement.

A minimum of nine hours of theatre electives need to be chosen from the theatre courses. One theatre class per semester is suggested.
