JUNIOR MARSHALS

They are two full-time students who are enrolled in campus-based programs and have earned between 79 and 110 hours (inclusive), of which at least thirty are graded hours earned at Southwestern, having the highest cumulative grade point averages.

PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARS

The Presidential Scholars are students that have an incoming GPA of 3.75 or 25 ACT score.

DEAN'S HONOR ROLL

The Dean's Honor Roll recognizes scholastic achievement of full-time undergraduate students during a single semester who earn 12 or more hours with a grade point average of 3.70 or higher.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholars

Phi Theta Kappa members earn and hold a minimum 3.2 GPA.

CAPITAL ONE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

Awarded by the College Sports Information Directors of America, this award recognizes academic and athletic excellence. To be nominated, a student-athlete must be a starter or an important reserve with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3, must have participated in at least 50 percent of the team's games, must have completed one full calendar year of attendance at Southwestern while achieving s ophomore academic standing or higher. Nominees are voted upon at a regional level, with regional winners advancing for consideration as Capital One Academic All-American recognition.

DISTINGUISHED SENIOR STUDENTS OF LEADERSHIP

Students have contributed 400+ hours of service, maintained a minimum 3.0 GPA, and earned a minor in Leadership.

HONORS IN THE SOCIAL SCIENCES

Students have completed 18 hours of honors course credit and a capstone thesis/project with a minimum 3.0 GPA in all honors coursework.

KANSAS ATHLETIC TRAINER'S SOCIETY HONOR ROLL

First Team All-Academic Honorees must be junior or above in academic standing and active within the professional phase of the ATP and have achieved a 3.80 GPA. Second 2nd Team All-Academic Honorees must at least be a junior or above in academic standing and accepted into the professional phase of their ATP and have achieved a combined minimum of 3.60 GPA. Honorable Mention All-Academic Honorees must at least be a sophomore or above in academic standing and accepted into the professional phase of the professional phase of their ATP and have achieved a combined minimum of academic standing and accepted into the professional phase of their ATP and have achieved a combined minimum of 3.40 GPA.

KCAC Scholar Athletes

Recognizes excellence in the classroom by student-athletes in the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference who have achieved sophomore academic standing at the start of their sport season, and who maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.33 while lettering in their sport.

NAIA DAKTRONICS SCHOLAR-ATHLETES

Recognizes excellence in the classroom by NAIA student-athletes who are juniors or above in academic standing with a 3.5 cumulative GPA. Students must have attended Southwestern for two full years as a non-transfer, or one full year as a transfer student.

PI GAMMA MU INTERNATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY SENIORS

Students have earned at least 30 hours of course credits from the Social Sciences division and a have 3.0 cumulative GPA.

UNITED METHODIST SCHOLAR AND UNITED METHODIST FOUNDATION SCHOLAR

Membership in a United Methodist Church earning a 3.0 GPA or higher with Intention to enter some form of vocational ministry (local church, missions, youth ministry, music ministry, etc.) and accepting the Discipleship Southwestern or Worship Outreach activity grant.

BETA BETA BETA BIOLOGY HONOR SOCIETY

The national undergraduate honor society for students in the biological sciences in which members must demonstrate an enthusiasm for the biological sciences and excellence in their science coursework.

COLE FAMILY SUMMER MUSIC FESTIVAL COUNSELORS

Students are selected from college applicants representing mid-west colleges and universities. Counselors serve as role models for campers by demonstrating respect and discipline to the festival values. At least rising juniors, they must demonstrate maturity, leadership skills, and musicianship.

DISTINGUISHED SENIOR STUDENTS OF CHRISTIAN DISCIPLESHIP

Students have contributed 200+ hours of service, participated in a weekly discipleship group, and earned a minor in Christian Discipleship.

DUNCAN FAMILY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to the Concertmaster of the South Kansas Symphony, or to a student member who shows leadership in the ensemble.

KCAC CHAMPION OF CHARACTER

Each KCAC team and sport selects one individual that best exemplifies the core values of the NAIA Champions of Character program.

LOIS MCNEIL GULLERUD ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded by the Chair of the Performing Arts Division to a student actively involved in music at Southwestern College, preferably a string player who is interested in pursuing a career in string music education.

MOST OUTSTANDING STUDENT ATHLETE

The top senior female and male student-athletes who demonstrate exceptional performance in athletics, academics, leadership and college and community service.

MUSIC TEACHERS' NATIONAL ASSOCIATION COLLEGIATE ENRICHMENT GRANT

A collegiate member attending a national event, specifically the MTNA National Conference or Collegiate Piano Pedagogy symposium. The recipient must be a collegiate member in good standing who demonstrates leadership. Preference is given to seniority.

NAIA ALL AMERICAN

The best NAIA student-athletes in each sport. Specific guidelines and criteria are set at the NAIA level by each sport.

NAIA CHAMPION OF CHARACTER

Awarded to one member of each team qualifying for NAIA National Championship events. Winners, as selected by their head coach, are those student-athletes who most closely identify with the core values of the NAIA's Champions of Character initiative (integrity, respect, responsibility, sportsmanship, servant leadership)

ROSS & AGNES WILLIAMS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

These scholarships are awarded to members of the Williams String Quartet. Members, who must also perform in the South Kansas Symphony, are selected by the Kilmer Endowed Chair of Strings Education. They represent the music department and college at many events on and off campus throughout the year.

SOUTH KANSAS SYMPHONY CONCERTO COMPETITION

This annual event gives Southwestern College students the opportunity to perform a solo with the South Kansas Symphony on the last concert of the season, showcasing a higher level of talent and achievement.

TEACHERS OF PROMISE

Students are chosen by the EDUC 440 teachers and the division faculty make recommendations and rate teacher education candidates who have completed professional core classes in good standing without areas of concern from previous instructors.

TONE **BUILDERS**

Students recognized for their leadership, service activities and commitment to the music department and demonstrates leadership of the organization.

INTERNSHIPS

Students in their first and second year at Southwestern College who will be assistants to the faculty in their assigned ensemble or track.

Students in the Natural Sciences are encouraged to apply for competitive research internships and fellowships during their sophomore and junior years are selected for positions at universities, research institutions and field laboratories throughout the United States.

Rocky Mountain Psychological Association exists for the purpose of advancing psychology as a science, as a profession and as a means of promoting human welfare in the States of Colorado, Arizona, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming. The RMPA is an advocate throughout all phases of professional development by the dissemination of scientific and professional ideas.

ACADEMIC ORGANIZATIONS

CAMPUS PLAYERS

Founded in 1919 has been both the honorary theatrical society of Southwestern College and the producing organization of all campus theatrical productions. Members are recognized for their talent, commitment, leadership and vision.

ENACTUS

An international non-profit organization that brings together student, academic and business leaders who are committed to using the power of entrepreneurial action to improve the quality of life and standard of living for people in need. Southwestern College's Enactus team seeks to create and implement community empowerment projects around the globe.

CAMPUS STUDENT LEADERSHIP

CLASS PRESIDENTS

A full-time undergraduate student with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 shall be eligible for the office of class president upon submission and certification of an official petition to the election committee that is signed by 25 different members of the represented class.

STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION EXECUTIVE TEAM

A full-time undergraduate student with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 shall be eligible for election certification of an official petition to the election committee including one-hundred (100) different signatures, without and repeat or infringement of signatures, of full-time Southwestern College students.

STUDENT FOUNDATION

Enrich the collegiate experience by providing quality, student-centered programs, services, and involvement opportunities which promote unity, diversity, and student development.

STUDENT LIFE RESIDENCE HALL STAFF

Promotes success in and out of the classroom and emphasizes community building, holistic learning, multicultural understanding, campus engagement, and leadership and works to provide an atmosphere that nourishes the learning, growth, and personal development of each resident within a cooperative community.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

On formal academic occasions the faculty appears in academic dress that originated in the Middle Ages. This dress includes the gown, the hood, and the mortarboard (cap). The gown distinguishes holders of the three degrees–doctorate, master's, and bachelor's. The doctoral gown is faced with velvet and has bell-shaped sleeves, on each of which are three velvet chevrons. The master's gown has sleeves which reach nearly to the knees and are slit above the elbow. The bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves and lacks the velvet trimming of the doctoral gown.

The hood indicates by the color of its velvet edging the area of study in which the wearer's degree was taken, and its silk lining displays the color or colors of the institution which conferred the degree. (For instance, Southwestern College's colors are purple and white.) On most campuses the most common degrees are in arts, letters, or humanities (white); business administration or accounting (drab); economics (copper); education (light blue); fine arts (brown); journalism (crimson); library science (lemon); music (pink); nursing (apricot); philosophy (dark blue); physical education (sage green); science (golden yellow); social science (citron); speech (silver gray); and theology (scarlet).

The mortarboard tassel of faculty holding bachelor's or master's degrees is usually black. Gold tassels are worn only by holders of doctoral degrees and by heads of institutions.
