Wallingford Hall – First Year Men's Hall

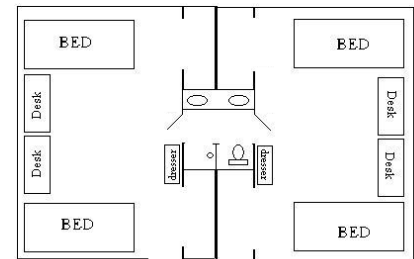
XL Twin Mattress

Window: 3'11" tall 4'8" wide, Floor to windowsill - 39 inches

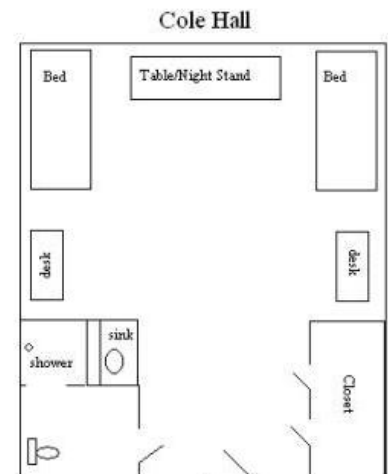
Ceiling: 10ft in bedroom, 7'6" in entry and bath

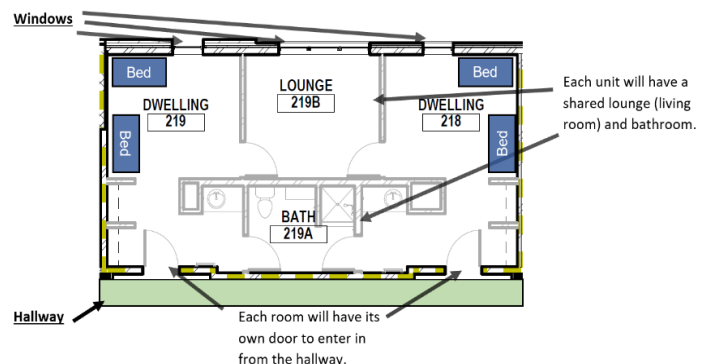

Prohibited Items

Incendiary items such as candles (unless wick is cut, or unlit), candle warmers, incense, heat lamps, & space heaters.

Kitchen appliances: Instant pots, air fryers, hot plates, electric skillets, toasters, toaster ovens are **only** allowed in Warren.

Dangerous items: knives in excess of 6 inches, decorative swords, guns (paintball, air soft, pellet), explosives, & fireworks.

Other items: Pets, doorbell cameras, hoverboards, TV mounts.

AVOID WALL DAMAGE FINES!

Do not use nails, screws, duct tape, or 3M hooks/tape on walls. Use poster putty or small tacks in limited quantities.

Do not hang LED lights with adhesive tape!

General Residence Hall Policies

DECORATIONS

- Nothing should be hung from the ceiling, over sprinklers, or covering smoke detectors.
- Decorations featuring alcohol, drugs or adult content must not be visible from outside the room.

DRUG, ALCOHOL, & TOBACCO REGULATIONS

The possession, use, manufacturing and/or distribution of drugs or alcohol on campus is prohibited. This includes storage of such items in vehicles parked on campus and the possession of paraphernalia designed for use with drugs.

- All “Decorative” or empty alcohol containers are subject to judicial sanctions.
- Smoking tobacco, using smokeless tobacco, or tobacco-less products (such as e-cigarettes or vape pens) is prohibited in residence halls and apartments.

FURNITURE: College furniture is not to be removed from rooms. The college will not store furniture or personal items. Lobby furniture is not to be moved to personal rooms.

GUESTS: Residents may only have overnight guests of same gender in their room. Arrangements must be made with the resident director at least 24 hours in advance. **Overnight guests may stay a maximum of three nights.**

- Residents are responsible for their guests’ behavior, and all policies apply to guests.
- Guest must be over the age of 18. Babysitting is not permitted in residence halls and in campus apartments.

HALLWAYS/WINDOWS

- No items should be placed in the hallway as it is considered a violation of fire code.
- Do not obstruct windows; do not attempt to exit room through windows. Do not place items on outside window ledges.

PETS: All pets must be approved through the Director of Residence Life. No furry pet will be allowed. Housing accommodations requests should be received **60 days in advance** for each semester.

PROPPING DOORS: Outside doors should not be propped open after move-in day.

QUIET HOURS: Quiet hours are from 10:00pm -10:00am. During these hours students are expected to keep noise at a minimum. In addition to quiet hours, the college enforces 24-hour courtesy hours. Students should remain respectful of others by limiting the volume of stereos, TVs, and voices so as not to disturb others.

TRASH: Room trash should be taken to the dumpster. Trash left in common areas may result in individual or community sanctions.

VISITATION HOURS *Hours remain the same over school/holiday breaks.

Broadhurst, Reid, Sutton, Winfield & Warren have 24 hour visitation, however, members of the opposite sex may not stay overnight.

Visitation is allowed in Cole and Wallingford Halls’ rooms by members of the opposite sex during the following hours:
