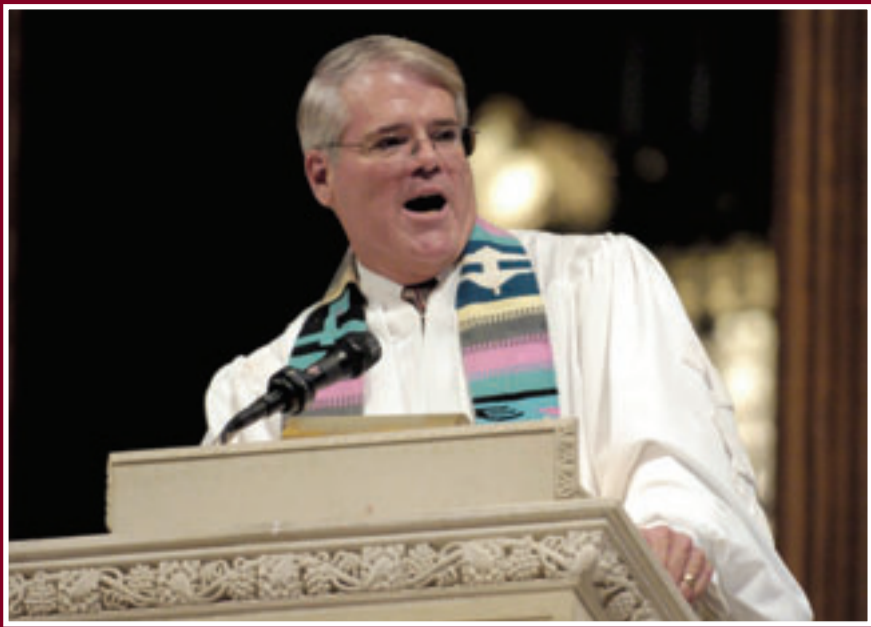


SC TRANSITIONS



Kelly Bender '68, senior pastor at Paradise Valley United Methodist Church in Arizona, was guest preacher at the Kansas Major State Day celebrated at the National Cathedral in Washington Aug. 21. As part of its national ministry, Washington National Cathedral offers prayers for the people and leaders of the states, and elevates each state with a major observance once every four years. Kansans are invited to participate in the leadership at the Washington landmark, where the nation holds state funerals and special events. Bender is a native of Ulysses, and became well-known to Kansans as senior pastor of Wichita's First United Methodist Church. He addressed the congregation from the historic Canterbury Pulpit, where the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King delivered his final Sunday sermon. C. Robert Haywood '83, formerly of Winfield, died Aug. 6, 2005. Haywood served as dean of the college at SC from 1948 to 1966. Haywood was awarded an honorary degree from SC in 1983 and was recognized as Outstanding Teacher by students at Southwestern in 1966. Generations of Moundbuilders will recognize Dean Haywood as the author of "The Mound Revisited," the epilogue to Dean Allen's Moundbuilding ceremony address. He was the author of eight books and numerous journal articles on higher education and Western and Southern history. In 1991 his book, *Victorian West*, received the Westerners International Award for Best Non-fiction Book on the West. In 2003 he was honored by the Kansas

Heritage Center in Dodge City for his contributions to books on Kansas history and most recently received the Cowboy Historian Award from the Boot Hill Museum, Dodge City. Survivors include his wife, Marie; a daughter, **Sandra Jarvis '64**, and a son, **Robert Alan '70**.

Tod Megredy, who had been on the communications faculty at SC and was director of publications, is now director of journalism at Emporia State University. **Jill L. Megredy '02**, Southwestern College registrar from 1996 to 2005, now is registrar at ESU. Tod and Jill and their two daughters, Sarah, 12, and Hannah, 8, moved to Emporia in August.
