








Cross Country Track Team, 1923-1924







Athens



Pelphi



STUDENT COUNCIL--First Semester

The Student's Council was organized in 1911 to permit a degree of self-government in matters concerning the students. Eighteen students, six elected from each upper class and three from each lower class, compose the Council's membership. Professor J. F. Phillips, vice-president of the college, acts as ex-officio president of the council. The other officers, a vice-president and secretary, are chosen the first of each semester by the newly elected council. Committees attend to special business.

It is the duty of the Council to deal with student enterprises, activities, and organnizations. The entire amount of student funds is under its supervision. The Council also awards athletic letters and emblems of honor for forensics. All the athletics of the school are under its directions.

The impotance of the Council is growing from year to year and plans are continually being made to make its work more effective.





STUDENT COUNCIL--Second Semester

The Student's Council for the second semester of the year 1923-24 has been confronted with many and varied problems, and in their solution many important changes of policy have been made. A great deal of consideration has been given to the granting of awards in athletics and a number of changes have been made. A better relationship between athletics and student government has been greatly aided by the exofficio representative of athletics who sits in the council meetings.

The Council has fostered student parliaments, giving a chance for the expression of student opinion. In these parliaments there has been an increasing amount of interest in student politics. It has given the Council an opportunity to keep in closer touch with the pulse of student opinion, and it has brought the students to a closer familiarity with campus problems.

The most important and far reaching work of the Council has been the revision of the constitution under which it works. The Student's Council has always been a most important organization in the management of school affairs, but more than ever before, the Council has taken an active part in the conduct of school affairs. The new constitution, which is to be put into effect next fall, will place a student as president of the council. It will give the students more complete representation and will increase the size of the student governmental body. It has been the purpose of the student law makers to get the view of the students, bringing all of the various departments of the College into closer cooperation.





A certain "atmosphere conductive to the development of moral character" has long been the distinctive characteristic of Southwestern. In creating and maintaining this "atmosphere," no other organization has been so largely responsible as the Christian Association. Its scope and influence has increased steadily through the years, and this year this progress has been especially evident. In addition to its basic purpose of "leading students to faith in God through Jesus Christ," the Association has earnestly endeavored to reveal to students this Gospel's social implications, in both immediate and world aspects. Campus problems have vied in interest with questions of international, industrial, interracial, and religious significance. The Association has brought to the college an unusual number of prominent leaders including: Ben Wilson, on the British Labor Party; Conrad Hoffman, chairman of the European Student Relief Enterprise; Ben Cherrington, International Y. M. C. A. secretary, speaking upon industrial problems; Alyn K. Foster, upon science and religion; George Collins, secretary of the Fellowship of Reconciliation; and Paul Blanchard, upon industrial democracy. Not satisfied in merely arousing student interest in problems to be faced in future citizenty, the Association has endeavored to lead students to see that "the issues of the campus are the issues of life"—that the campus society is world society in miniature. Closely related to these developments are two which can be accounted singular; first, the degree of co-operation between the Y. M. C. A. and the Y. W. C. A; second, the success of the joint Sunday-afternoon discussion groups.



Classes of the society were instructed this year by Mr. Suter.




Southwestern Collegian




The Moundbuilder



The Band

As one step in the achievement of our aim—A Greater Southwestern—the Southwestern College Band stands today as the best college band in the state, both from the point of numbers and from the standpoint of musical ability. Under the able persevering leadership of Professor C. O. Brown, the Band has developed from a scattered group of individual instrumentalists, into a compact, efficient, musical organization of no mean ability. Today the S. C. Band of fifty pieces, splendidly uniformed in nifty monogramed white sweaters, purple trousers or skirts, and purple and white overseas caps, present a spectacle unique in the annals of college band activities.

A short summary of the Southwestern Band's achievements will merely enhance in the reader's mind its value to the college. The Band's first meeting was on September 19, 1923 and the history of the band from that date forward has been one of steady advance and achievement. The uniforms were purchased soon after, and the appearance of the Band in their new uniforms for the first time in chapel, created one of the big sensations of the year. On October 23, the Band gave a concert, assisted by the Fine Arts Faculty, which drew probably the biggest crowd of any musical event of the year. The Band has proved its real worth to the college and its loyalty to the student body by the regular and enthusiastic attendance of this organization at all intercollegiate contests in which S. C. participated, and it played an immense part in the morale of both team and spectators.

The Band has also participated in other events of note-worthy character. It has filled several out-of-town engagements and faithfully represented Southwestern at the International Wheat Show. Although holding only one regular practice each week, the Band has acquired musical ability of such character that its fame as the best college band in the state has spread far and wide. The Band has rendered much service to the college in other forms. It has played on several occasions when the College was entertaining large numbers of out-of-town guests, such as the Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church and the District Basket Ball Tournament. The concert of the combined bands of Winfield—that is, the college and city

bands—given in April was likewise a success.









