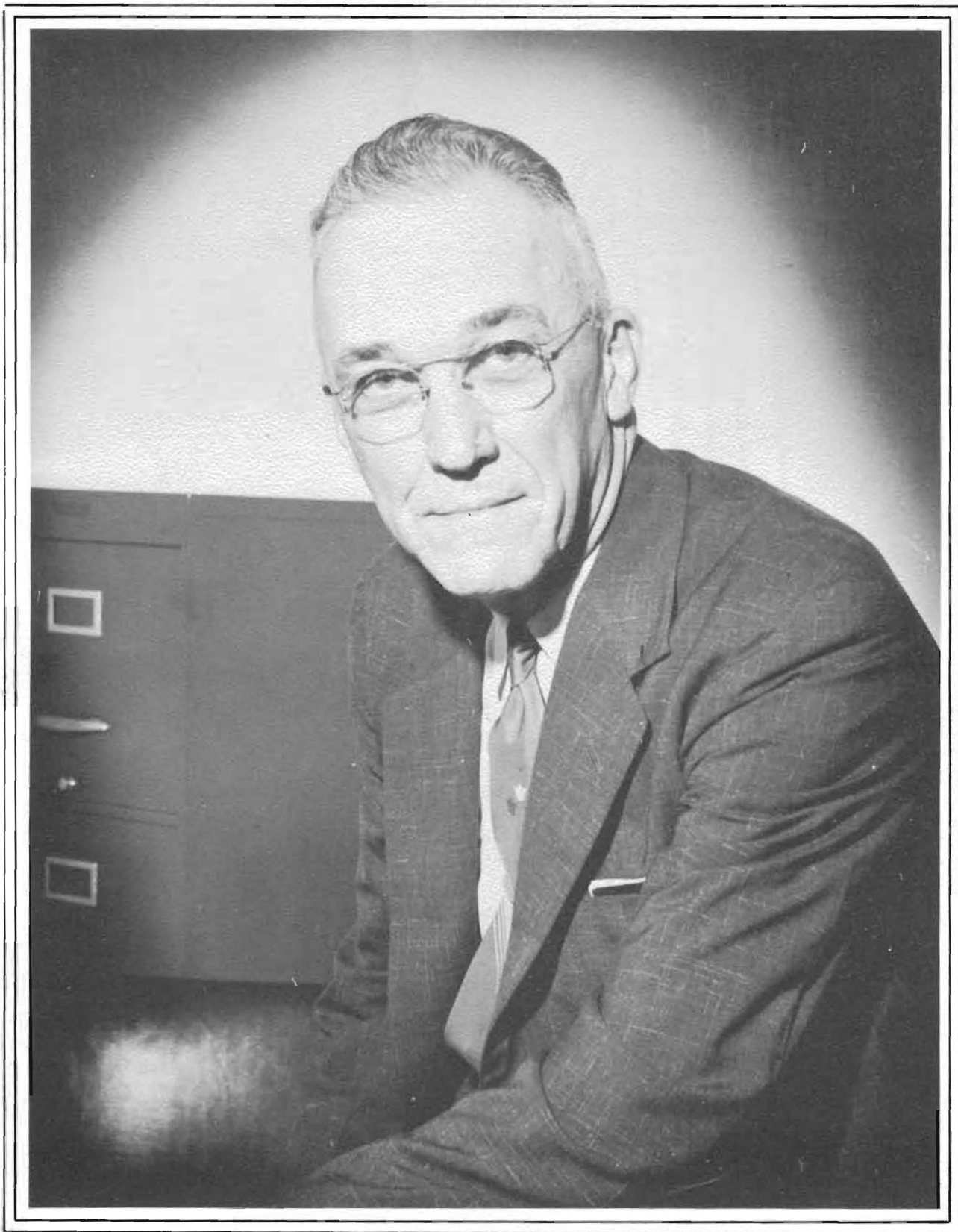

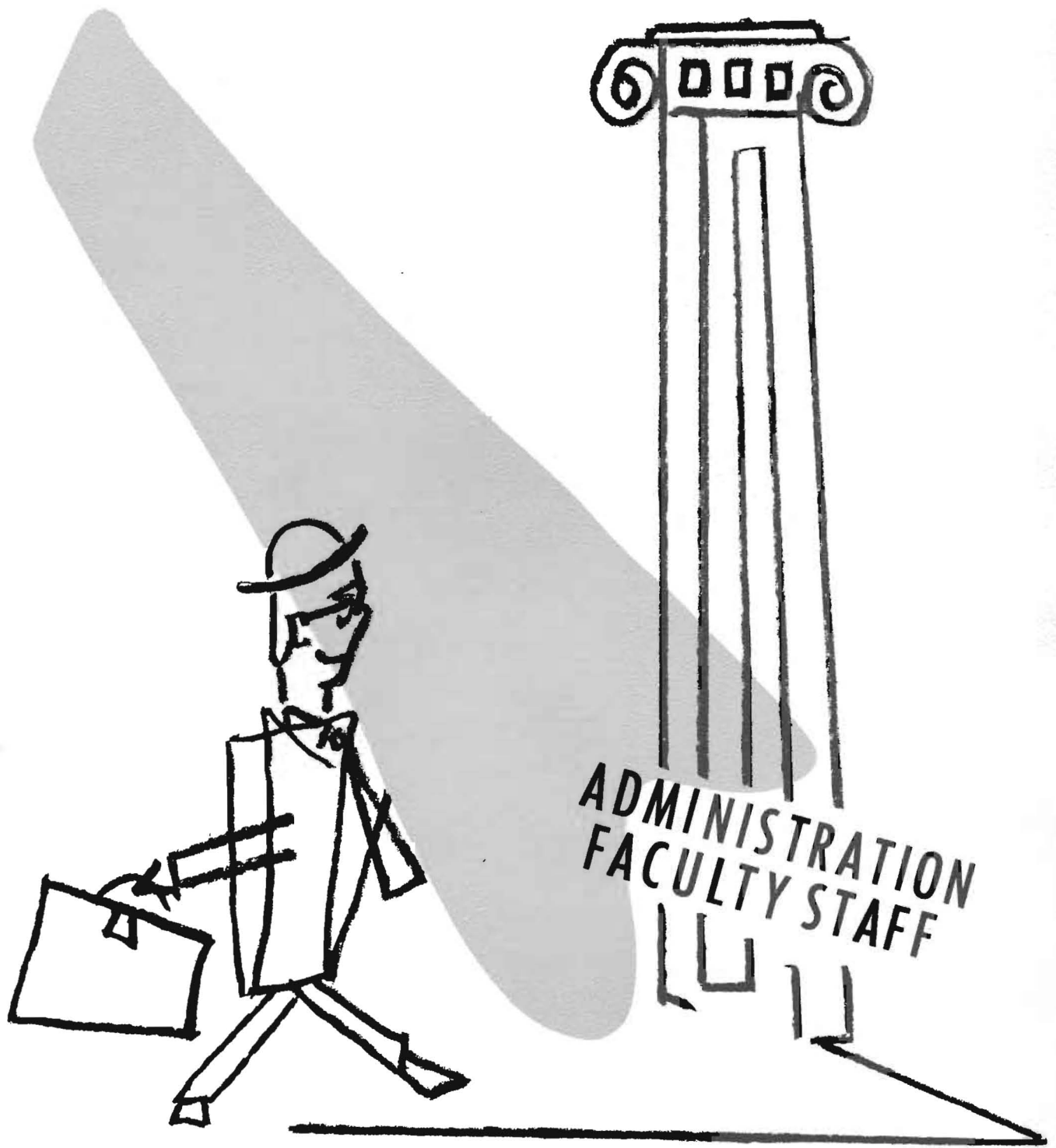

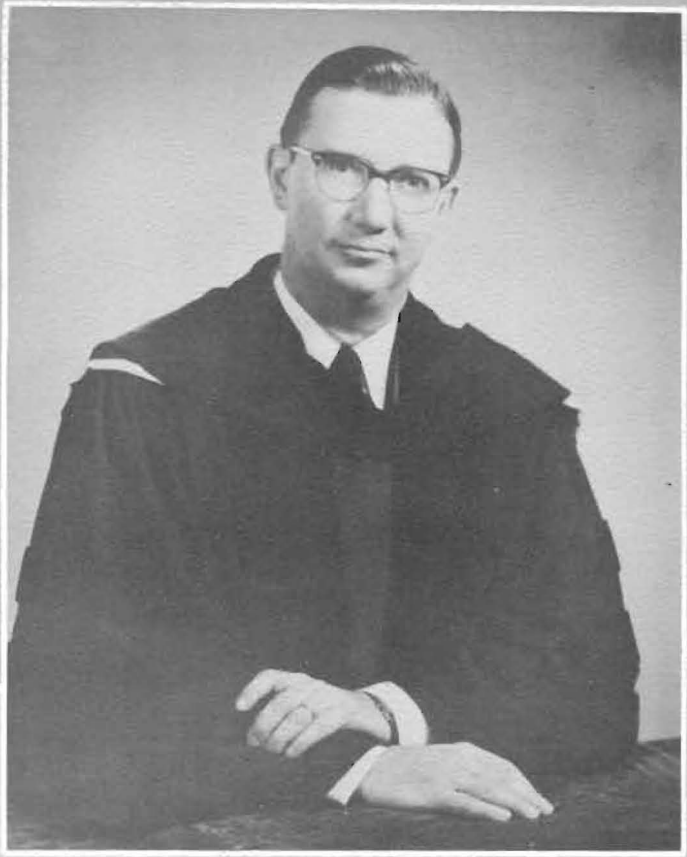
At Southwestern he has been teacher, basketball coach, dean of the college, and is now serving as the director of student personnel and admissions.

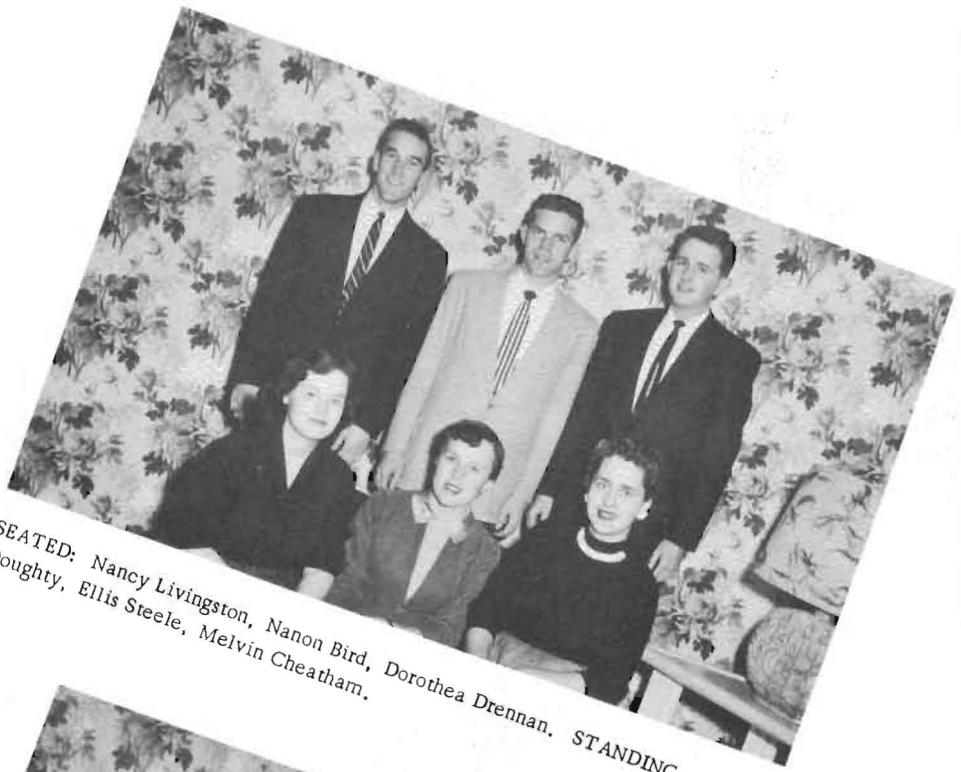

You couldn't have sold stock in the Southwestern college basketball team for popcorn—r, say, the price of a Homburg at—before the team took the court last night in the N. A. I. A. basketball tournament in the arena of the Municipal Auditorium.

Maybe not even to the 200 students, or the faculty members who shut down the school yesterday for two days, and ran back off together in three buses, and numerous motor cars for the 200-mile trip from Winfield, Kas., to Kansas City.

Boost to Their Price.

But look out for the price now. If the Cinderella victory over a highly touted Loyola of Los Angeles team, 83 to 79, has any reason, it is watch your basketball investments when the boys in the pep club show up in Homburg and smoking gear.

The wise money boys around the press box before the game had summed up Southwestern's chances succinctly:

"They don't even belong in the tournament."

As for the students, like Bill Bryson, Wichita, a cheerleader, they were not surprised at the crappiness shown by their team against the Californians, who are looked such formidable foes as the University of Southern California and Santa Clara. Still, they may even have been one of the Homburg pep club boys, Bob Bradley of Lawrence, Kas., who said as the game started, "I'm surprised we got this far." No one was heard to dispute him.

Not in Since 1943.

Southwestern hasn't been in an N. A. I. A. tournament since 1943.

A resurgence of spirit this year is typified by the Homburgs, or, in the case of Bill Williams of Cedarvale, Kas., a black derby, or white corduroy numbers in a Homburg shape, a couple of others of the even pep club boys so equipped.

"Somebody around school just started wearing one," Bradley said, "and others in the pep club sort of followed along. We just decided to buy the cigars in the way up here. I guess you could say they were good luck charms in a way."

Bradley had a car horn, with his girl's initials painted on it, and the others, Glenford McDonald of Caldwell, Kas.; Melvin Cheatham, Winfield; Larry Selerman, Wichita; Pete Moore of Wichita, and Dick Redfield of Winfield, Kas., had cowbells or at least a fancy vest or sport coat. Half the school enrollment of 400 saw the game.

Time From the 1930s. As soon as the team ran out to warm up, the band broke into "The Dipsy Doodle"—a swing tune from the 1930s that became a school pep song in some fashion unknown to most of the students.

"It just seems fantastic that our team should be here," observed Anita Martin of Winfield, who sat behind the pep club boys. Still the students betrayed no lack of confidence in their opening cheers.

For a while it looked like the smart money boys were all downstate. Loyola jumped into a quick lead, 12 to 5, before the game was five minutes old.

Then something happened. The Winfield boys started to scrap. Perhaps the din from the Southwestern section helped, but, as the students said, the aggressiveness was no surprise. The Moundbuilders just started to wag the rebounds and their shots started going in. At half-time, it was 22 to 11 for Southwestern.

Close All the Way.

Any number of times in the last half Loyola tied things up and once forged a 3-point lead. Finally, with only two minutes to go, Southwestern slipped ahead, 78 to 76.

"Oh you guys, come on," yelled Anita Martin.

All the Southwestern rooters were on their feet, shouting, "Go, go, go, go!"

A couple of rough scrambles and Southwestern had 83, and the clock was running out. Loyola hit a field goal to make it 82, but the clock clicked off three, two, one and then the game was over.

Anita Martin put her fingers to her mouth and whistled like a boy. Her friend in the next seat, Lois Finer, Norwich, Kas., screamed. The pep club boys changed cowbells. And the band, so excited it could hardly play, broke into "The Dipsy Doodle."

The experts downstate began to talk about St. Benedict's college, another Kansas team, which was strictly nowhere when the tournament opened last year. Who do you think won the state championship?
