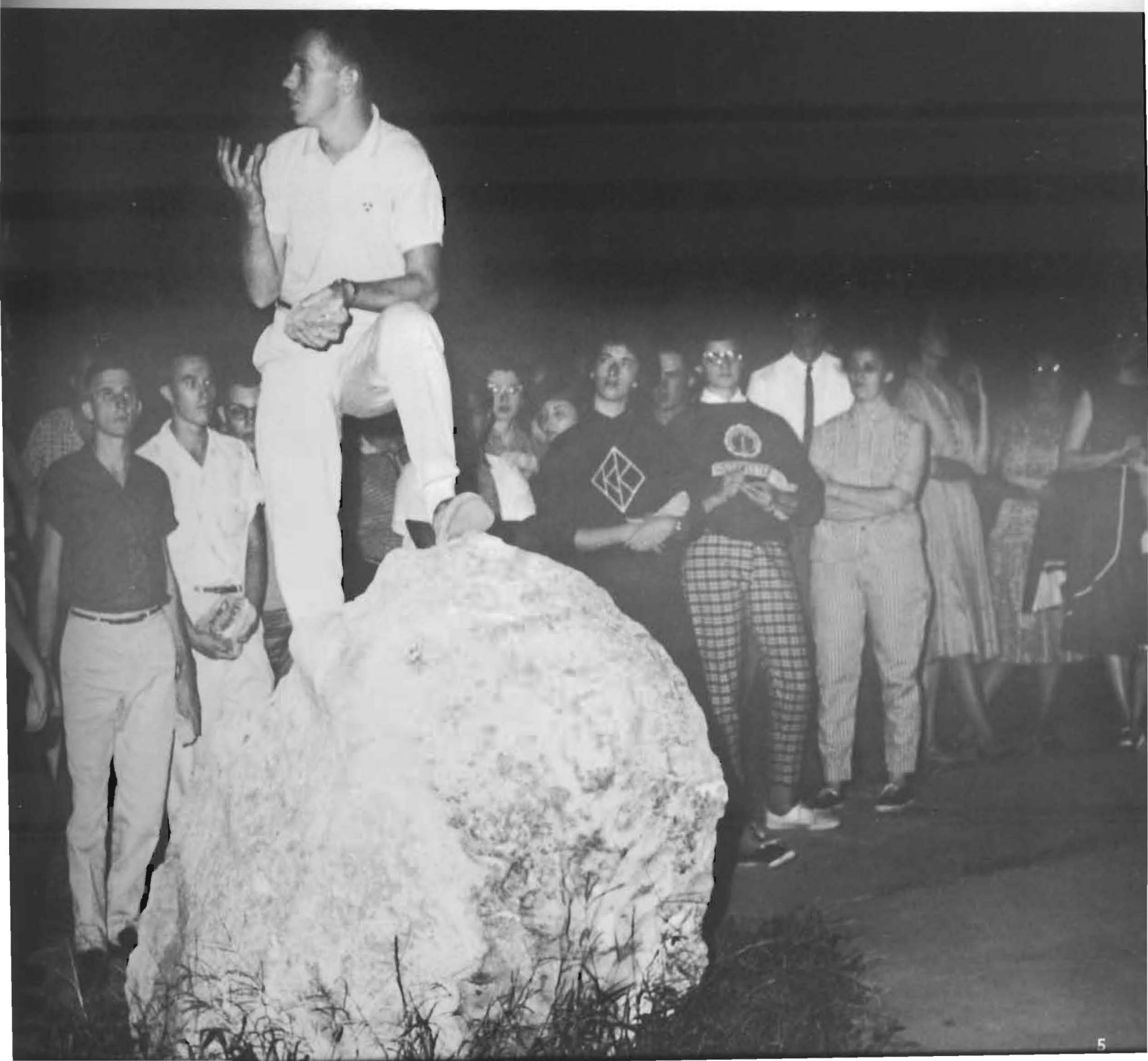
Campus . . . *page thirty.* The suspense of an exciting football game or the thrill of a Conference victory seems to bind hundreds into oneness as they pull for S.C.

Athletics . . . *page ninety-four.* Professors and students share a learning experience; associations are formed that will last a lifetime:

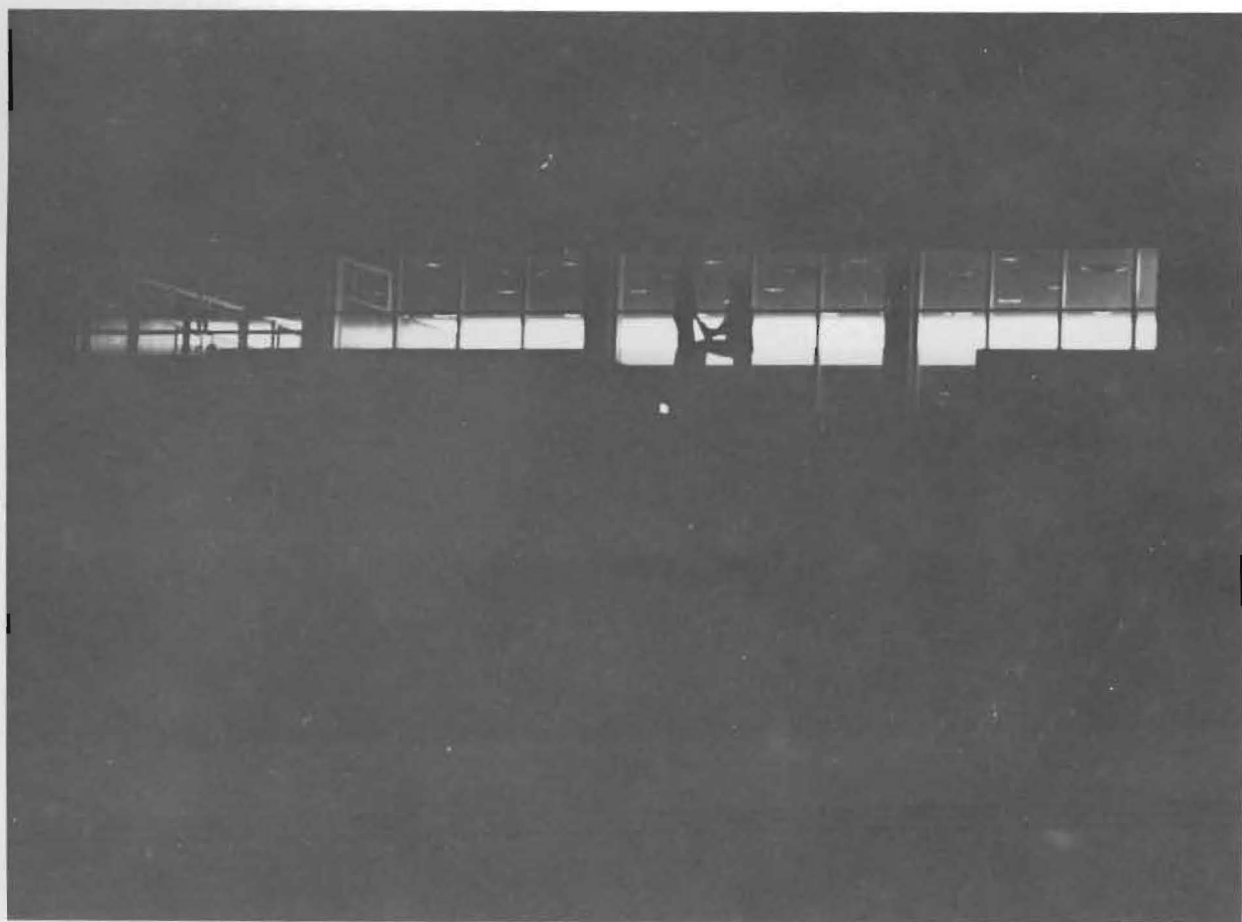
People . . . *page one hundred twenty.*

of belonging.

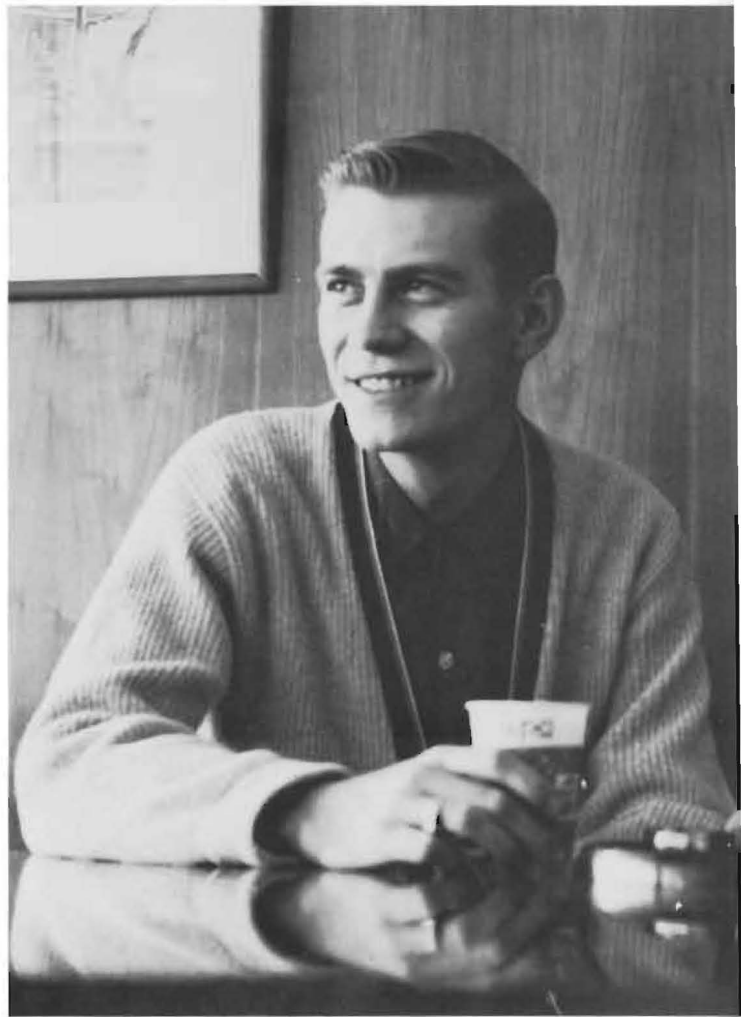
But an exam failed,

Studying . . .

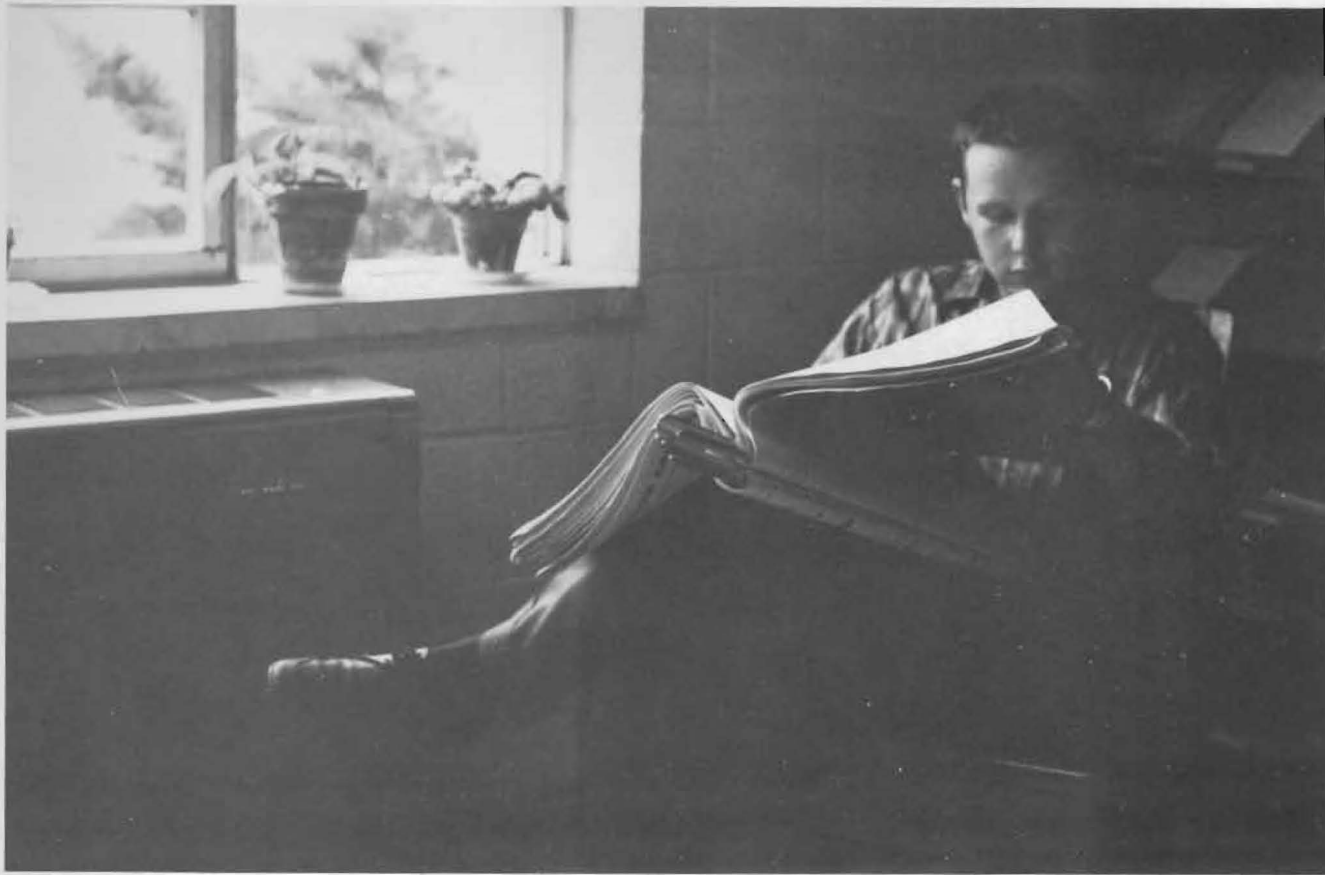
The why of school;

Relaxing . . .

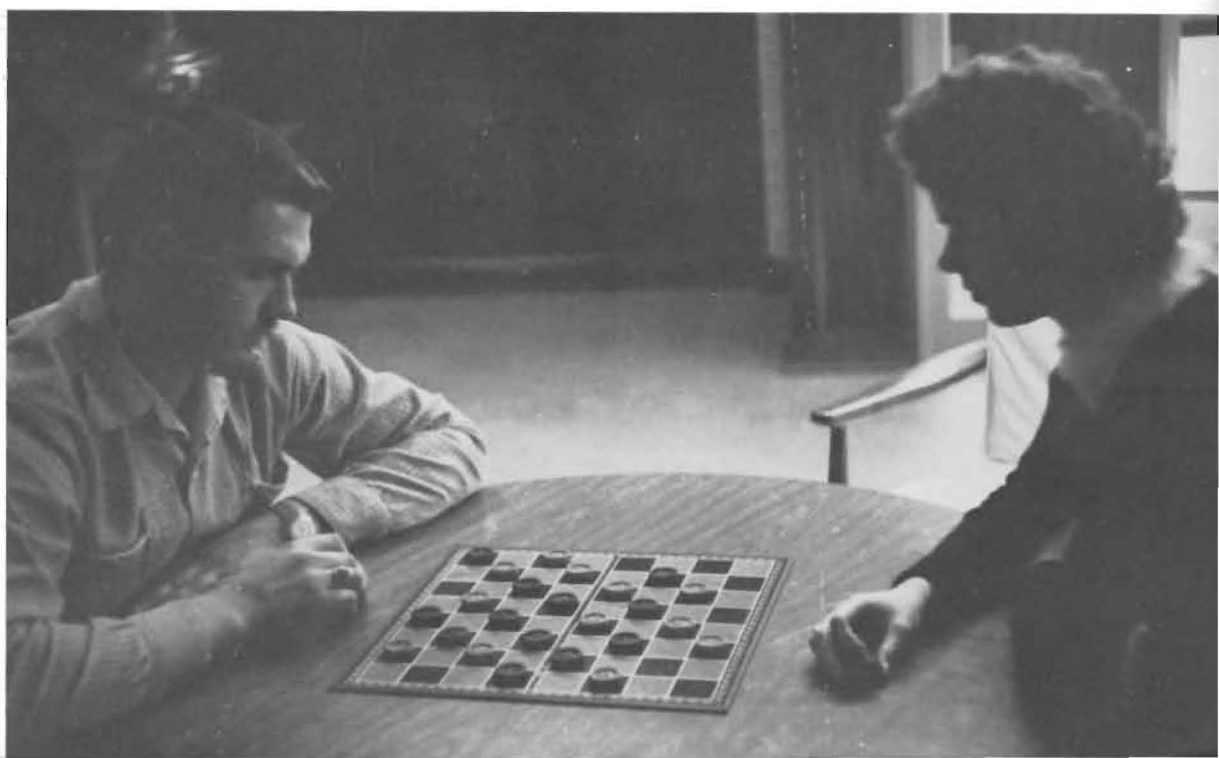
The break from mental tension

 unexpected rarity.

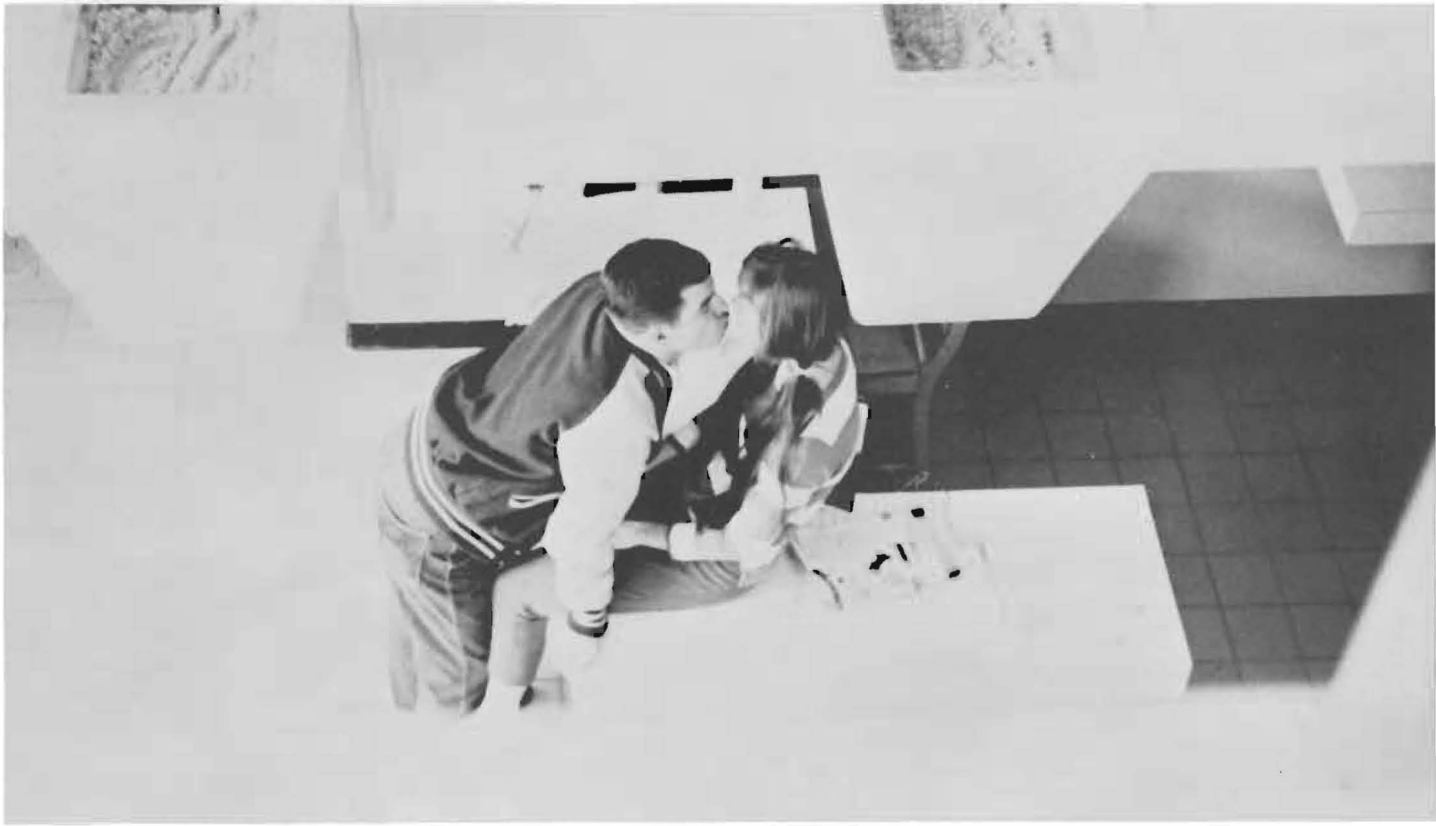






Moments caught;

 lost forever.

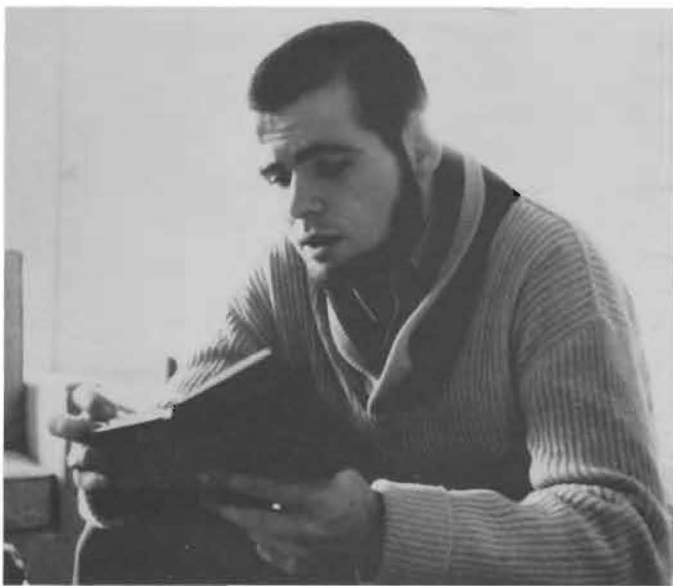








Lost in a myriad

. . . relaxing.



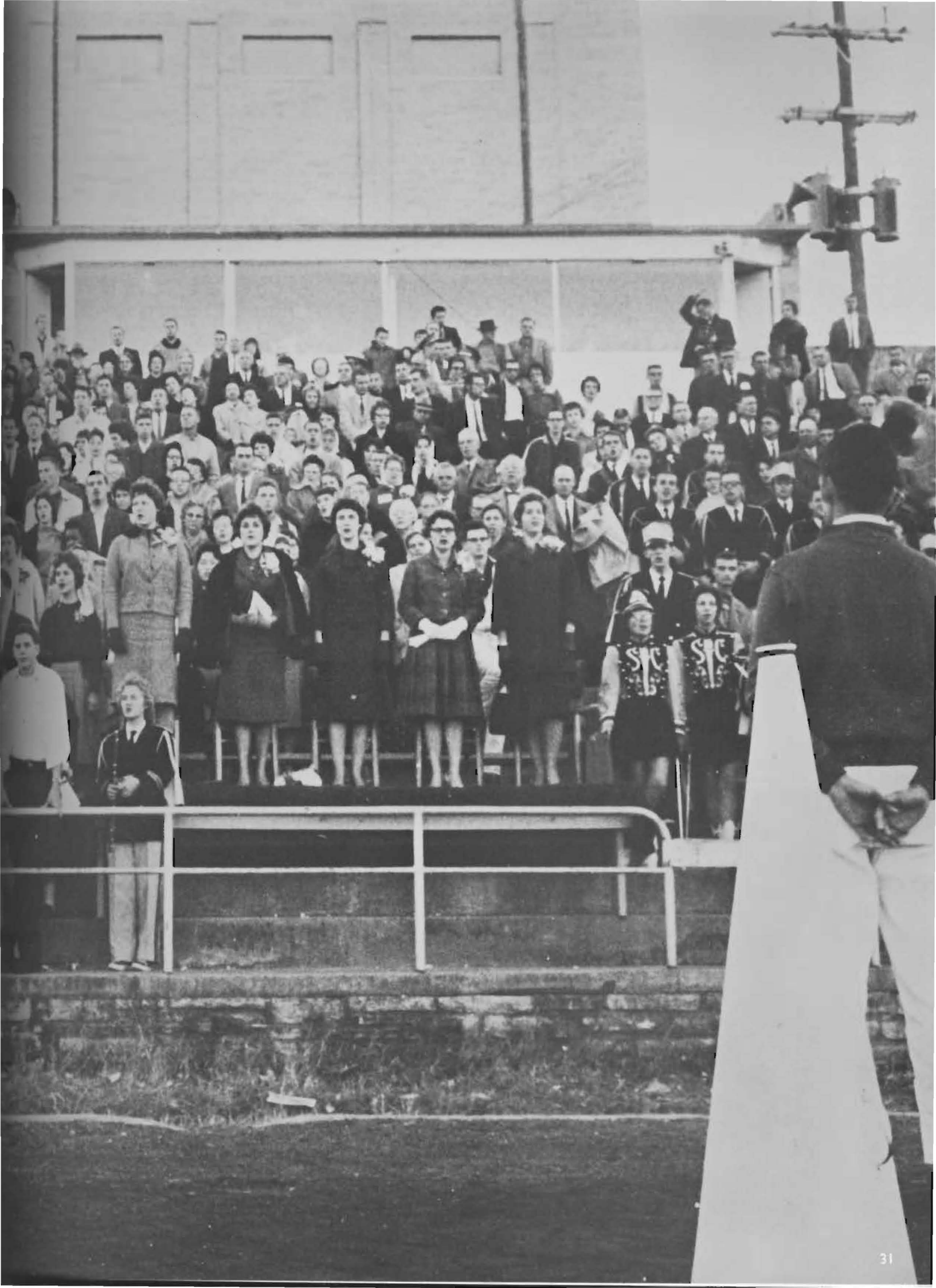
