Keynote Speaker



Dr. Lester Ruth

Dr. Lester Ruth is the Lily May Jarvis Professor of Christian Worship at Asbury Theological Seminar and a member of the Texas Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church.

Prior to teaching at Asbury Seminary, Dr. Ruth was assistant professor of Liturgical Studies at Yale University Divinity School and Institute of Sacred Music.

His book, A Little Heaven Below: Worship at Early Methodist Quarterly Meetings, was awarded the Jesse Lee Prize by the United Methodist General Commission on Archives and History. He has also received three teaching awards at Asbury Seminary, two for use of media and one for extended learning. He was on the advisory board for the Calvin Institute of Christian Worship liturgical renewal grants program from 1999 to 2004.

Dr. Ruth is currently editing a multi-volume set of worship case studies from church history as well as continuing research into the theology of contemporary worship music. Dr. Ruth and his wife, Carmen, have two daughters.

EARLY BIRD WORKSHOP: The Crafting of Worship Music By Martin Rude and Friends

Psalms 100 and 150 instruct everyone and everything to praise the God of creation, the God of covenant and the God of salvation in worship. What does the Lord require from those of us who lead this musical worship?

We will examine three areas: first, choosing the words in the songs that we author, second, the ways we use these songs in worship, and third, the power of sung theology in non-worship settings such as devotional, internet and radio settings.

This time will be facilitated by alumni Steven Butler, Allison Reed, Rev. Mitch Todd, and Travis Hastings, who are involved with the writing and recording of the new Southwestern worship CD. Martin Rude will direct discussion as we look into the theology of the songs and their role in worship and non-worship settings.
