JourneyKids Voice Placements

The Community Music School's JourneyKids Choir is a performance ensemble comprised of students in grades 3-6 (from the Walnut Valley region and surrounding counties). The Goal of the ensemble is to provide a collaborative and welcoming environment for the development of lifelong skills and a love for music.

Rehearsals take place in Darbeth Room 207 on the Southwestern College Campus on Tuesday evenings from 5:30-6:30pm starting on September 19, 2017. A couple of performances will take place during the spring semester, including an Elementary Honor Choir Day at Southwestern College in January 2018.

Nikki Kirk is the Director of the JourneyKids Choir. Mrs. Kirk have over 10 years of experience of teaching and has taught general music, band and choir in the public schools of Kansas, in her home state of West Virginia, and has served as Instructor of Music at Coffeyville Community College. She received her BA in Music Education while studying trumpet and voice at Glenville State College (Glenville, WV), and is currently pursuing a Masters in Curriculum and Instruction with a focus in Elementary Music Curriculum.

The fee per semester for involvement in the group is \$15/month/student or \$100/year/student (on or before September 30th). Payments are made at the first rehearsal of each month or can be paid in full at the first rehearsal.
