<u>Meaningful</u> <u>Practice</u>

These are a few tips to creating a meaningful practice session, as it is the best way to hone the craft of instrumental or vocal music.

1. Find somewhere quiet.

This will help prepare you mentally for this very particular kind of work

2. Have your supplies nearby.

Keep a pencil sharpener and a very clean eraser within arm's reach, along with a pencil to mark up your music. Simple, right? But those little things are easy to forget, and if you have to go searching for them, add up to a big waste of time.

3. Use technology to your advantage!

Get a free metronome, a tuner and a timer. These will help maximize practice sessions and habits.

4. Have a set goal each time you go in to practice.

Before you start, think: What do I want to accomplish today? If you're not sure what you need to focus on, ask your teacher for a few concrete goals to work toward before the next lesson — and write them down.
