Under the supervision of Festival Dean, Dr. Timothy Shook, the festival will feature five award-winning faculty conductors:



DR. DAVID GARDNER, CHOIR. Before coming to Southwestern he was conductor of the Tucson (Ariz.) Masterworks Chorale and Orchestra, a group which grew four-fold during his tenure. He is the recipient of numerous awards, including a second-place finish in the 2001 American Choral Directors Association National Student Conducting Awards Competition, and the 2005 Fassnacht Outstanding Faculty Award. He is also active as a guest conductor and baritone soloist. Dr. Gardner's Carnegie Hall conducting debut was in March 2005.

STEPHEN BUTLER, WORSHIP TEAMS. Stephen Butler earned his master in worship studies from the Institute for Worship Studies in Orange Park, Fla. Butler is a music pastor at First Baptist Church in Arkansas City, Kan., and is a faculty member at Cowley County Community College. He also writes and arranges cantatas, as well as performing concerts throughout the Midwest.





PROF. DANIEL STEVENS, ORCHESTRA. In addition to his responsibilities as director of strings at Southwestern, Stevens is founder of the Southwestern College Youth Symphony and conductor of the South Kansas Symphony at Southwestern. Stevens is a D.M.A. candidate and former graduate teaching fellow at the University of North Texas. He is a professional violist with the Tulsa Symphony Orchestra/Opera and has been a featured soloist and chamber musician.

MELISSA WILLIAMSON, FLUTE CHOIR & MUSIC THEORY. Melissa teaches music theory, private flute, flute choir, woodwind methods, and is the administrator for the new Community Music School program at Southwestern College. She is also is the Assistant Director of Campus Life. Williamson holds her master's degree in music pedagogy and performance from Oklahoma State University.





PROF. CHRISTOPHER SCHMITZ, JAZZ BAND. Director of bands at SC since 2003, Schmitz is the winner of the 2007 Sammy Nestico Award for Jazz Composition. He taught in the public schools for several years before accepting a jazz studies assistantship at the University of Northern Iowa. While there, he founded and directed the Cedar River Jazz Band, an elite high school jazz ensemble.
