

SC ACHIEVEMENTS

Brenda Hicks, director of financial aid, presented a session, "Battle of the Brains," at the annual Rocky Mountain Association of Financial Aid Administrators (RMAFAA) meeting. The session was designed to encourage participants to use their right-brains.

Stephen Rankin, professor of religious studies and chair of the philosophy and religion department, read a paper at the Oxford Institute for Methodist Theological Studies in Oxford, England. The title of the paper is "Re-balancing the Cognitive Legacy: the Religious Affections in Christian Formation." Rankin also filmed a video segment on the Wesleys' conversion experiences that is part of the Wesley Ministry Network.

Phil Schmidt, professor of history and chair of the history and political science department, and **Stephen Woodburn**, assistant professor of history, attended the Mid-America Conference on History in Tulsa, Sept. 28-29, 2007, where each presented a paper. Schmidt's paper was "Riding Their Gentle Hobby: A Statistical Analysis of the Sexist Coverage of Woman Suffrage

by the *New York Times*, 1867-1920." Woodburn's paper was titled "Nikolai Danilevsky and *Russia and Europe: Struggle vs. Decline.*"

Christopher Schmitz, assistant professor of music and director of bands, has received his first official publication contract. The work is "Transformations" and the publisher is Walrus Music Publishing, one of the premier jazz publishers for school big bands, etc.

Michael Tessmer, associate professor of chemistry, **Rick Cowlshaw**, assistant professor of biology, **Charles Hunter**, professor of biology, and **Jason Coy**, assistant professor of history at the College of Charleston (formerly of the Southwestern history department), had an article published in the September issue of the *Journal of College Science Teaching*. The article was related to a classroom simulation of the Kyoto Protocol agreement to lower greenhouse gas emissions that the authors developed for use in the general education course Science, Society, and the Environment (formerly called Planet Earth.) The case itself was first published in the online

collection at the National Center for Case Study Teaching in Science.

Nili Luo, professor of early childhood education, is author of two recently-published articles: "A Cross Cultural Study on Relationships Among Early Childhood Educators' Expectations and Children's Food Choices, Eating Habits, and Physical Activity" *Fulfilling Our Dreams by Bringing All Cultures Together—Monographs*; and "Father on Earth and Father in Heaven," *Chinese Today Monthly*, October 2007.

Zhiquan (Timothy) Qian, affiliate faculty in art, published three recent articles: "Farewell to the Past," *Chinese Today Monthly*, October 2007; "The Distance between the Birth and the Death," *Chinese Today Monthly*, July 2007; and "Obedience—The Spirit of the Cross," *Christian Life Quarterly*, March 2007.
